Breaking Down Barriers

Foundation-funded school field trips provide access

Wide eyes and huge smiles peeked out of a school bus as it pulled up in front of the Bent Bridge. Eager students, grades 1-4, from LUCHA Elementary School were coming for their first Happy Hollow Foundation-sponsored school field trip at Happy Hollow Park & Zoo. Of the 152 students, 100 were visiting Happy Hollow for the first time, which is surprising since the school is only two miles away and most of these students live within miles of this special place.

"I have so many wonderful memories here with my family and I wanted to share that with my students. This is such a peaceful place," beamed Richelle Shimada, a second grade teacher at LUCHA. "For some of our students, this is their first field trip ever because of Covid and coming to Happy Hollow makes it all the more amazing."

The field trip program provides students from underresourced schools throughout Santa Clara County direct access to engaging, memorable science learning experiences. The pilot program started in 2019 thanks to a few faithful donors who covered the cost while the program was being tested. It was an overwhelming success and the foundation has brought 1,500 students to the park and zoo since the program launched with nearly 50% of those children visiting Happy Hollow for the first time.

The program provides transportation, free admission and includes an educational assembly where students learn about animals by seeing them up close. Encounters with education animal ambassadors help people feel more connected to animals, and motivate them to take action to protect the natural world. The rest of the day students get to explore the zoo, romp around on the grass and enjoy the amusement park. When the exhausted and happy children depart, they receive an educational booklet (created by the foundation's 21/22 youth board member) and a \$5 coupon so the child can bring back their family.



Our donor's passion and generosity has allowed us to expand and serve even more students for the 22-23 school year. "Funding field trips through Happy Hollow Foundation is one of our most important initiatives. It's about providing accessibility for students who might otherwise never have the opportunity to experience Happy Hollow Park & Zoo," said Rhonda Nourse, the foundation's executive director. "Learning through play sparks curiosity about nature, science and conservation. This is incredibly beneficial to the students, teachers and parents, and in turn, is good for the entire community."



Four male Chacoan peccaries, an endangered piglike species, joined the zoo family of Happy Hollow in November 2022. Chacoan peccaries were thought to be extinct. But in 1975, living individuals of this species were found in Gran Chaco, South America making it one of the most recently discovered large mammals of our time.

"Adding this endangered species to the Happy Hollow collection strengthens our commitment to the conservation of species that need our help while giving zoo visitors the opportunity to connect with an animal they might not otherwise get the chance to see in person," said Amber Rindy, Happy Hollow zoo manager.

After breaking ground on the design last year, the exhibit was completed just in time to accommodate the arrival of the peccaries from The Living Desert Zoo and Garden in Palm Desert, CA. The expansion included enlarging the habitat by combining the previous collared peccary and Parrot Island habitats in the Zoo in the Hollow. This new habitat includes two animal shelters and three separate yards to allow for the possibility of breeding in the future. Planted trees and grasses imitate the peccaries' natural habitat and includes a small valley and hill and plenty of rocks to scratch up against.

Much thought and detail goes into a project of this magnitude from the design to the transfer of the animals so that the new habitat provides comfort and enrichment.





Chacoan peccaries are part of an Association of Zoos and Aquariums Species Survival Plan, which coordinates the placement of individual members of the species at zoos and sanctuaries nationwide and ensures that breeding activity supports the genetic health and long-term viability of the species.

Senior Safari returns with thousands of seniors visiting the park and zoo



The silver tsunami is back at Happy Hollow Park & Zoo. Senior Safari came roaring back to life in 2022 after a two-year hiatus due to the Covid-19 pandemic. This program is designed to help older adults improve their health, avoid social isolation and enjoy a unique environment that stimulates both mind and body.

There were hundreds of bright smiles and eager seniors who happily returned to Happy Hollow. Kaiser Permanente, our presenting sponsor, was steadfast in its commitment to Happy Hollow Foundation until it was safe to resume the event. Karla Rodriguez Lomax is the Director of Public Affairs there and said, "Kaiser Permanente is thrilled to once again support Senior Safari at Happy Hollow Park & Zoo. No matter what your age, being physically active and engaged in the community is critical to maintaining total health and wellness."

Senior Safari offers a comfortable place to walk in a natural setting and caters to everyone from active 50+ seniors who seek out the hula hoops to older adults in wheelchairs who glide peacefully through the quiet park. There are docent-led tours of the zoo, animal meet and greets, a watercolor station, a 10,000-step challenge and much more.


The event is free — from parking to admission — and while it officially goes from 9-10 a.m., participants can stay and enjoy the park all day.

Senior Safari launched in March 2014 and attendance has nearly tripled in seven years. It's

The annual project is a wonderful opportunity to create a lasting impact at Happy Hollow. There is no end to the possibilities of what a project could

entail and students have the freedom to create and develop an idea with the oversight of the foundation's executive director and a lead board member. Past projects have included The Waggle Dance exhibit, a permanent part of the Backyard Habitat in the Lower Zoo, which is an educational and movement experience based on the motions of honey bees. Another youth board member created a social media campaign. Most recently, a youth board member created an eight-page educational activity booklet that was printed for students who attend the foundation-funded school field trips.
