

We're "all in" on monarch conservation

Phase II of Monarch Meadow engages corporate partners

With its iconic black and orange markings, the monarch butterfly is well-known in California. At Happy Hollow Park & Zoo, we are doing our part to be "all in" to protect pollinators like the monarch. Pollinators provide vital benefits to people and wildlife - keeping animals and plants that we depend on thriving while bringing us food and supporting the economy. Pollinator populations across the United States are declining and that's why we built Monarch Meadow at Happy Hollow!



Monarch Meadow is a large-scale pollinator garden that promotes water conservation, habitat restoration and biodiversity. It is a capital improvement project that is part of Happy Hollow's Master Plan and aligns with conservation initiatives required to be an accredited zoo by the Association of Zoos and Aquariums.

Happy Hollow Foundation launched a Corporate Partnership program in 2024 with California Water Service, Dinsmore Landscape Company and UA Local 393. These organizations dedicated 400 volunteer hours over the course of four days in October to install Phase II of Monarch Meadow.

Monarch Meadow weekend kicked off with students from Bellarmine College Prep's garden club. SENIOR SAFARI CELEBRATES A DECADE OF IMPACT



On a crisp, sunny morning in May, more than 600 adults gathered at the gates of Happy Hollow to celebrate the opening of the tenth season of Senior Safari presented by Kaiser Permanente. This anniversary season kickoff also included local dignitaries, elected officials and program sponsors. Happy Hollow Foundation received a commendation from City of San José Mayor Matt Mahan who recognized the significant impact of the Senior Safari program on the community. "Senior Safari is fun, it's healthy—but more than anything, it's connecting us as human beings in a community. It really makes a difference to have community, to have social connection, to know that you're not alone," said Mahan.

Last year, San Mateo County became the first in the nation to recognize loneliness as a public health emergency. Senior Safari participants have shared that social isolation and loneliness are real mental health concerns. "Senior Safari is really a special day since Covid. The world has changed and we still have this wonderful free day!" said one participant.

In one decade, this program has positively impacted the lives of 27,000 older adults.

The 2024 season served an all-time high of 4,079 older adults and the June safari saw an all-time single safari attendance record of 998 people. Senior Safari is a joint program of Happy Hollow Park & Zoo and Happy Hollow Foundation designed to promote healthy living, decrease isolation and build community for adults ages 50 and older and is 100% free to attendees.

FIVE YEARS AND COUNTING FOR TITLE I SCHOOL PROGRAM



Glee, wonder and delight! That's the feeling students have the moment they cross the Bent Bridge in anticipation of a special day at Happy Hollow funded through donor support. The Title I Educational Enrichment Program is designed to be engaging and interactive, encouraging students to ask questions and participate actively. This fosters curiosity and a deeper interest in science and nature and the hands-on interaction is crucial for their understanding of various scientific concepts.

For many children, a visit to Happy Hollow is their first exposure to such an environment, making it a memorable and impactful experience. Ninety percent of the 150 students from Gardner Academy had never been to Happy Hollow before this experience. Similarly, at Montgomery Elementary, about 45 percent of the 128 First and Second graders who visited had never been to Happy Hollow. The opportunity to return with their families, facilitated by discounted coupons extends the educational benefits beyond the initial visit. It allows children to share their knowledge and experiences with their families, further reinforcing their learning and fostering a sense of pride and accomplishment.

POSITIVE CHILDHOOD EXPERIENCES FOR FOSTER YOUTH



We talk a lot about the "magic" of Happy Hollow, and in this instance, there is science behind a single visit to Happy Hollow. A unique partnership between the Child Advocates of Silicon Valley (CASV) and Happy Hollow Foundation is invaluable for children in foster care in Santa Clara County providing not just the magic of a Happy Hollow experience, but also healing. "These children, often victims of abandonment, abuse, or neglect, have experienced significant trauma, including the additional distress of being removed from their homes for safety," said Frederick Ferrer, CEO of CASV. About 50% of these children have faced four or more adverse childhood experiences which the Centers for Disease for Control states can lead to long-term negative impacts such as risky behaviors, chronic health conditions and early death.

Donations to Happy Hollow Foundation play a crucial role in mitigating these effects through a program called "CASA Days at Happy Hollow" which provides positive childhood experiences shown by scientific research to improve health outcomes. A day at Happy Hollow provides five types of these positive experiences: access to nature, mental health care, nutrition, physical activity and supportive relationships. These experiences are essential for fostering resilience and promoting healing in these children.

This past year, Happy Hollow Foundation was able to fund another opportunity for positive experiences thanks to a "Healthy Living Grant" from long-time partner, Kaiser Permanente. Families in the Dependency Wellness Court program enjoyed a Friendsgiving Meal at Happy Hollow complete with all the trimmings!

These are families that, acknowledging they need support, enter a voluntary program through the Court that helps them be accountable for the changes they need to make to recover.

Seeing their parents being respectfully served by staff during the Friendsgiving celebration can help children view their parents in a positive light. Honorable Judge Erica Yew, the court's presiding judge, also joined the families for lunch which further reinforced the restoration of respect and dignity to the families being served through this program. A visit to Happy Hollow is a powerful tool in helping foster children overcome the effects of trauma. By providing a safe and nurturing environment filled with positive experiences, donor support helps these children heal and grow, offering them a chance to simply be kids and enjoy the joys of childhood.



Cheers to You Event

The "running of the herd" delights all







Happy Hollow's goat herd stole the show at the Dreambuilders' Cheers to You event last spring. This donor appreciation event was held at Double-H Ranch at Happy Hollow. The focus was to showcase the recently completed Zoo Education Animal Ambassadors' exercise and sunning yard — a project partially funded through donations to Happy Hollow Foundation. During this extra special behind-thescenes experience, Dreambuilders met members of the education animal collection like the great horned owl, Brazilian tree porcupine and eclectus parrot. We learned how each of these animals benefits from this new area. "This area can be a play space, game or activity space, a flying run, a space for additional climbing or alternate terrain opportunities that encourage additional exercise," said Kristy Benner, Education Coordinator at Happy Hollow.

"The animals can explore with all of their senses and experience more enrichment and activity opportunities. A snake can enjoy a vertical climb up a pegboard. Our parrot can play a game of 'hopscotch' as he bounces between stairsteps of parallel perches. Sometimes our great horned owl just sits very still, absorbing the sunshine and eyeballing the distant crows. This is what she considers fun!"

During the event, the Contact Yard was open to meet and mingle with the new goat herd. The ring of the bell is a training tool used at the end of the day to signal to the goats that it is time to transition from the Contact Yard to the night yard. Guests lined up to witness the "running of the herd" as they ran to their night house in anticipation of dinner! It was such a fun sight to see that is not a typical Happy Hollow experience.




